### ABOUT THE PIECE

May This Place is an SATB setting of an original poem. I don't usually set my own poetry but this particular text is quite close to my heart. It was written in 2018 after some impactful experiences that made me reconsider the meaning of love and family. It is a fairly simple setting intended to allow the text to shine through. "This land, our home, this place of love." is the final line of text that is sung, followed by a wordless, pensive ending to represent the inexpressible feelings associated with such topics.

During his time at the Choir School, Nicholas also learned to play the pipe organ under the direction of his first organ teacher, Peter Daly.

After high school, Nicholas continued his studies at the University of Toronto, Faculty of Music, completing a Bachelor's Degree in Organ Performance with a minor in Composition. He studied organ with John Tuttle and composition with Roger Bergs, two fantastic musicians and educators. Nicholas now works professionally as an organist, pianist, singer, choir director, composer, arranger, and more!
